# Attendance

- Attendance is critical to a students learning.
- If your child is absent you must contact the Academy.
- The attendance team will ring on the day of the absence and the next morning to support the students return to the Academy.
- Absence for a lengthy period of time will require proof of a visit to a Doctor.
- Students must be on time; the gate closes at 8:26am.
- A warning bell rings between each lesson and at the end of break and lunch, giving students time to get to their lessons.
- Holidays must not be taken in Academy term time. These will be deemed as an unauthorised absence and a penalty notice may be issued to parents.



# Reading is important at OMA

## Reading Aloud

- ◇ All Year 7 students will experience a range of novels.
  - ◇ The teacher will read, and students follow.
  - ◇ Reading Aloud will take place in tutor time.
- ◇ Reading Aloud also forms part of the English curriculum.
- ◇ Reading a range of novels improves students' experiences of reading and builds cultural capital.
- ◇ Students will discuss aspects of their novels in English lessons; one lesson per week is dedicated to Reading Aloud.
- ◇ Students requiring reading intervention will receive this in dedicated sessions.

# Home Study

- At Ormiston Maritime Academy students will receive regular work for home study.
- The work for home study will be from all of their different subjects.
- The home study work will be set on a variety of platforms.
- Home study will be communicated home via the EdulinkOne App.
- Students are encouraged to use subject specific knowledge organisers to help them with their home study.
- Students are encouraged to seek help from their teachers if they need it.

# Academy Life

## Lunch Arrangements

- Healthy, hot and cold meals can be bought in the Academy canteen via a cashless payment system.
- Each student has their own personal account; a finger print scanning system (biometrics) is used whereby students scan their thumb and the cost of items is taken from their account. Parents can 'top up' with funds via the Academy website or students can add funds to their account by using the 'top up' machines located in Centrepoint.
- Students may bring a packed lunch to the Academy
- Food must only be eaten in the Zone and Courtyard areas.
- Parents/ carers of students entitled to free school meals will need to make the appropriate application. Please contact the academy office to request an information leaflet and an application form.

## Valuables and lost property

- ◆ Students are requested not to bring valuable items or large sums of money into the Academy.
- ◆ Students are responsible for any personal item brought into the Academy.
- ◆ Students should not leave their belongings in classrooms.
- ◆ Student names should be on every item of student uniform.
- ◆ Lost property is handed in to Student Services. If your child has lost something they should enquire at Student Services in the first instance. Lost property is reviewed every half term and will be recycled to charity if not collected.

# Mobile Phones

Mobile phones present Academies with unique problems. On one hand, students and parents may rightly see them as a means of supporting students' safety on the way to and from the Academy, especially in winter.

On the other hand they:

- have been found to hinder with communication between home and Academy
- are a proven serious distraction from students' focus on their work
- cause an unacceptable waste of staff time when used inappropriately
- have been used as a means of intimidating and bullying other students
- are attractive to potential thieves
- are prohibited by all Examinations Boards and QCA in all tests and examinations.

We would like to keep a reasonable and workable approach to retaining the benefits to students having mobile phones and ensure that none of the unacceptable consequences of their presence in the Academy are endured.

We ask therefore, that you and your child help us by being aware of the following:

1. The Academy cannot accept responsibility for their loss or damage however caused.
2. It is illegal to attempt to use a mobile phone capable of taking photographs for that purpose on Academy property. The use of this technology to bully, intimidate or otherwise harm others on the way to and from the Academy is a serious offence.
3. The law deems it to be the responsibility of the students, parents, guardians or carers if their child brings a mobile phone into the Academy.
4. If a parent, guardian or carer wishes their child to keep a mobile phone with them, the following must be complied with:
  - (a) **It must be switched off as soon as the student arrives at the Academy gate and be placed in their bag until they have left the Academy building at the end of the day.**
  - (b) Any mobile phone that is seen or heard during the Academy day will be immediately confiscated. The member of staff confiscating it will seal it in an envelope bearing the students name and take it to the main office.
  - (d) Any mobile phone confiscated for inappropriate use can only be collected by the student from the main Academy reception at the end of the day. Parents/carers will be asked to collect a mobile phone of repeat offenders.
  - (e) Refusal to hand over a mobile phone for confiscation, or repeated use of a mobile phone on the premises, will result in the child being forbidden to bring the phone to the Academy.

# Consequences

C1

Verbal warning - The wrong choices are being made

C2

Student is asked to move to another part of the classroom.

C3

Removal from classroom to discuss the incident with an on call member of staff. A detention is also issued for the following day.

C3 fail

Placed in Reflections for 5 consecutive periods.

# Wearing the Academy Uniform

Wearing the Academy uniform is an important factor in establishing a pride in and identity with the Academy and at the same time minimises social divisions between students.

We expect all students to represent Ormiston Maritime Academy

- ◇ Wear the Academy uniform with pride

**We would ask you not to buy any advertised brands/examples bearing logos and ensure that shoes are plain black and polish-able with no coloured tags, logos, stripes, piping, decoration or laces in any other colour but black.**

# Academy Uniform

## Boys

- Plain black school trousers. Trousers must be worn outside socks
- White plain collared shirt
- Black polishable sensible shoes, not trainers or leisure shoes
- Academy clip-on tie
- Black blazer with academy badge
- Academy cardigan (optional)

## Girls

- Plain black school trousers. Trousers must be worn outside socks
- Plain black knee length skirt: this must be purchased from Uniform Direct, no other skirts will be permitted in the Academy
- Plain black tights (40+ denier must be worn)
- Plain black socks
- White plain collared blouse
- Academy clip-on tie
- Black polishable sensible shoes with no heels not trainers or leisure shoes
- Black blazer with academy badge
- Academy cardigan (optional)

## PE kit - must be brought to every PE lesson

- Academy red and black top with academy logo
- Plain black shorts or black with red flashes
- Red socks
- $\frac{3}{4}$  or full length plain black bottoms
- Black hooded top



## **Blazer**

- This must be a black academy blazer with the Ormiston Maritime Academy logo on the top pocket
- This must be worn at all times – travelling on corridors, in social areas, entering and leaving classrooms, entering and leaving the academy grounds. Teachers can grant permission to students to take the blazer off inside the classroom.
- Students are permitted to remove their blazer at break and lunchtimes if outside or playing football
- Long sleeves must be down at all times
- Collars must be flat
- No badges to be worn unless presented by the academy or its staff

## **Tie**

- Official academy clip-on tie, which should be clipped on at fastened top button.

## **Outdoor wear**

- Coats must only be worn over the top of the blazer, not underneath
- Hooded tops are **not** acceptable in the academy or instead of a blazer
- Outdoor coats should be removed as soon as the student enters the academy

## **Shoes**

- These should be plain black and polishable with no coloured tags, logos, stripes, piping, laces or decoration.
- They should be flat and must have toes, sides and full backs.
- Black canvas pumps, boots and trainers are not permitted.
- During inclement weather students are permitted to wear alternative footwear for their journey to and from the academy but they will be expected to change into their normal academy footwear on arrival.
- Boots and shoes with steel toe caps are not permitted.

### **Gloves, scarves and hats**

- Gloves, scarves and hats are not allowed to be worn in the school building.

### **Bags**

- Should be large enough to hold an A4 folder without it having to be bent or folded.

### **Jewellery**

- A wrist watch
- Earrings – no more than one small stud (plain gold or silver) in each earlobe
- No other jewellery is permitted
- No other facial or body jewellery is permitted
- Tattoos and multi-piercings, including facial piercings are **not** permitted and must not be visible

### **Hair**

- Should be neat and not follow the extremes of fashion
- Should be of a natural colour and must not follow the extremes of fashion
- No shaved patterns allowed
- Hair accessories (hair bobbles, Alice bands, clips, slides etc.) should be appropriate for the Academy and should be plain black
- Long hair needs to be tied back in PE, Science and Technology

### **Make-up**

- Nail varnish is not allowed.
- False nails and acrylics are **not** allowed
- Make-up should be barely noticeable

The Principal reserves the right to send a student home if they are not in appropriate uniform.

Please note the following uniform regulations, which apply to boys and girls:

- ◆ Whilst in uniform students are to follow Academy rules.
- ◆ Academy uniform is to be worn when representing the Academy.
- ◆ Students are expected to wear their uniform correctly to and from the Academy. Students should wear their blazers inside the Academy building and on their journey to and from the Academy.
- ◆ Permission must be obtained from the Principal if a student needs to change out of uniform before leaving the Academy.
- ◆ Any items of jewellery that do not meet the Academy requirements will be confiscated. The member of staff confiscating it will seal it in an envelope bearing the students name and take it to the main office.
- ◆ Any jewellery confiscated for inappropriate use can only be collected by a parent/ carer from the main Academy reception until 3:45pm each day.

### **Students not in uniform**

- ◇ Parents/carers should send a note in to the Pastoral Coordinator if their son/ daughter for some reason is not dressed in appropriate uniform.
- ◇ Students will be provided with Academy issue uniform or shoes (and expected to wear them) as a short term measure.
- ◇ It is the responsibility of parents/carers to ensure that their child has correct uniform at all times.

### **PE kit information**

- ▽ If your child has an injury or medical issue a note will be required.
- ▽ Your child will not be excused from PE but will be given an amended role within active lessons such as officiating, scoring, coaching, etc.
